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What is ECIHSA?

ECIHSA stands for Early College in High School Academy. West Allegheny currently offers 20 ECIHSA programs in partnership with four postsecondary institutions, Robert Morris University (RMU), the Community College of Allegheny County (CCAC), the Community College of Beaver County (CCBC), and Rosedale Technical College (RTC). In 2017, West Allegheny School District established its first partnership with CCAC to provide our high school students access to college credit while taking West Allegheny courses, taught by West Allegheny teachers. This program has since expanded to include our three additional partners--RMU, CCBC, and RTC. For the 2024-2025 school year, our concurrent enrollment program includes 48 West Allegheny courses for a total of 203 available college credits. Additionally, we also have 10 dual enrollment programs (3 CCBC, 7 RTC) where students attend classes at one of our partnering institutions to earn credits towards an accelerated certificate or associate degree and their high school diploma.

What does concurrent enrollment mean and is it different from dual enrollment?

Concurrent Enrollment is a term used for courses that earn both college and high school credit but are taught in the high school by high school teachers. West Allegheny currently offers 48 concurrent enrollment courses which cover 65 college courses for a total of 203 available college credits.

Dual Enrollment refers to courses taken at a partnering institution, taught by the partnering institution's faculty. These courses also provide students with both college and high school credit. West Allegheny currently offers 10 dual enrollment programs (3 with CCBC, 7 with RTC).

Benefits of taking High School Courses for College Credit

Is there a difference in the course if I take my class for college credit or not?

No. The curriculum content and level of rigor are identical, regardless of a student taking the course for college credit or not.

What are the benefits of taking my eligible courses for college credit?

Research (American Institute for Research, 2020; Atchison et al, 2019; Bell, 2019; College in High School Alliance, n.d.; Gaille, 2018; Pineda, 2022) shows that students who participate in early college courses while in high school are more successful in their post-secondary endeavors. Although West Allegheny does not require students to take eligible courses for college credit, we do recommend it so that students can begin building their college transcript while in high school. One of the many advantages to pursuing the college credit is that it evidences that the student is willing to challenge themselves with college-level coursework while in high school, making them more competitive in the college admissions process. Courses completed through WAHS's ECIHSA program may save a student time and money after high school as they are highly transferrable to other institutions.

Where do credits transfer?

The transferability of college/university credits is reliant on the accepting institution. However, both CCAC and RMU have articulation agreements with many colleges/universities which may be available directly through the institution. Additionally, we have found the website <u>Transferology</u> to be easy to use and reliable. This site will provide information on transferability of college credits to your preferred college/university. WAHS school counselors can also assist families by initiating communication with colleges/universities about transferring credits.

Do students have to continue at the college/university after graduating from West Allegheny?

No. Students who elect to take WA courses for CCAC or RMU credit are not committed to continuing their education at those institutions after graduation. The credits offered through our ECIHSA courses are highly transferrable and may help students lessen their required course load at the post-secondary institute of their choice.

Do I still have to take the AP exam if I take an AP course for college credit?

Yes. All students enrolled in AP courses are required to take the AP exam in May. West Allegheny School District pays for all AP exams.

What if the course I am in is not part of my future course of study? Would taking the class for college credit be a waste of money?

Earning college credit for high school courses can save students time and money after high school. In most cases, courses that do not directly align with a student's post-secondary plan will most likely be accepted as general elective credit. Additionally, building a college transcript while in high school will help show a student is college-ready when applying to a post-secondary institution and/or career opportunities.

What if I take a course for college credit but get a bad grade?

A benefit to taking the courses available for college credit is that students have all of the support of a high school student which may help them to earn a higher grade than if they were to take the course on their own, without support. However, it is also important to note that if a student is considering transferring the credit to a different post-secondary institution, the credits transfer in most cases, not the grade. For example, if a student earns a C for AP English Language and Composition through RMU while in high school then chooses to continue their education at Penn State University, only the credits for this course would be reflected on their Penn State transcript. The letter grade of C would not negatively impact their college GPA.

Registering for College Courses

When is West Allegheny's deadline for placement testing and registration?

Placement testing is required for two of our courses offered through CCAC: Intro to Game Design & AP Computer Science A. Students who wish to register for either of these courses musts have successfully met the placement test requirement before registering. All course registrations will be open until the Friday after Labor Day.

Can I sign up for college credit after the course is over or later in the school year?

Unfortunately, no. All registration forms must be submitted by the deadline. No student will be able to register for a course after the registration window closes.

How do I register for college credit for my eligible courses?

In the beginning of the year, students will receive directions for how to register for their course(s).

<u>RMU</u>: Students will complete registration and payment through RMU's online portal: <u>highschool.rmu.edu</u>

<u>CCAC</u>: Students must first apply to CCAC (which requires students to submit the parent authorization dual credit form and transcript), complete any required placement test, and submit the registration form given. More information about CCAC-specific courses can be found in the <u>CCAC Specific Questions</u> section of this document.

Advanced Placement (AP) vs Early College (ECIHSA)

What is the difference between AP and ECIHSA?

AP is a College Board program that has an end-of-course exam. Most post-secondary institutions award credit for college courses if a student earns a 3, 4, or 5 (set by the college/university) on the corresponding AP exam.

ECIHSA is an agreement between WAHS and our post-secondary partners that awards college credit to students who register with the college/university for their eligible courses. These credits are **not** dependent on AP exam performance. The student's grade is dependent on the coursework that they complete throughout the year as reported by the WAHS teacher or dual enrollment teacher.

Is my college credit dependent on my AP exam score?

No. Earning college credit is only dependent on your registration for the course which takes place in September and earning a passing grade in the course. AP exams are end-of-course exams designed by the College Board to provide students with an opportunity to demonstrate their learning from the school year. Scores from AP exams are released in July. Final grades for ECIHSA courses are submitted to the corresponding post-secondary partner in May.

What is the benefit of taking an AP course for college credit?

The college credit available for all our ECIHSA courses that are also AP is highly transferrable and not dependent on high-stakes end-of-course standardized tests. Likewise, each college/university identifies the minimum score required for students to be awarded course credit because of the corresponding AP exam. Some schools only require a 3, while others may require a higher score. We recommend students taking eligible courses for college credit to remove some stress that may be caused by such exams.

Tuition

What are the tuition costs?

West Allegheny's unique partnership with CCAC, RMU, CCBC, and Rosedale includes a significantly discounted tuition rate for all ECIHSA students. The rate for our concurrent enrollment courses for the 2024-25 school year are:

- CCAC \$126 per CCAC course (plus a one-time \$25 matriculation fee)
- RMU \$250 per RMU course (no additional cost for 4-credit courses)

Please note that some of our courses cover multiple college courses.

West Allegheny strives to remove barriers and increase access to post-secondary pathways for all students. As such, any student who is in need of financial support may apply by submitting the <u>ECIHSA Financial Support</u> <u>Request form</u>. This includes students in need of a payment plan.

What if I cannot afford the tuition?

Any student who is experiencing financial hardship can request financial support by submitting the <u>ECIHSA</u> <u>Financial Support Request form</u>. To learn more about this, contact Dr. Roche (<u>kroche@westasd.org</u> or 724-695-5259).

Students who receive special education services or free or reduced lunch may receive a full scholarship from the district after completing the <u>ECIHSA Financial Support Request form</u>.

How do I pay for my courses?

Students will pay the college/university directly unless a <u>ECIHSA Financial Support Request form</u> is submitted and approved. Once submitted, Dr. Roche will work directly with the student to determine the level of financial support provided and/or develop a payment plan for the student.

All other students will be responsible for paying the college/university directly.

Will I receive a 1099 for my ECIHSA courses?

Only students who pay the college/university directly will receive a 1099.

CCAC Specific Questions

Why do I need to complete the online CCAC application?

CCAC requires students ALL students who are in a CCAC-aligned course to either take the class for CCAC credit or audit the class. In both instances, a student must apply to CCAC and be assigned a CCAC student ID, generated through the application process.

How long after I complete the CCAC online application will it take to receive an email from CCAC with my student ID?

It could take a few days to receive the email from CCAC. If you do not receive it within a week, please email Dr. Roche (kroche@westasd.org).

What does it mean to audit a course?

Auditing a course means that you are taking a course but not receiving credit for the course. All coursework and requirements remain the same. All students auditing a course must still be registered through the college. Which courses are CCAC-aligned courses?

How do I register for the CCAC placement test?

- First, students must apply to CCAC through their website (one time only).
 - 1. Apply to CCAC
 - 2. Select Dual Enrollment student
 - 3. Create an Account (anticipating enrollment Fall 202#)
 - 4. Choose Current High School Student
 - 5. Complete and upload the <u>CCAC Dual Enrollment Parent/Guardian Authorization Form</u>
 - 6. Email <u>Dr. Roche and Mrs. Heyl</u> that you have completed your application (we will send your transcript)
- You will then receive an email from CCAC with your acceptance and student ID number.
- PRACTICE for your placement test! 😊
 - 1. CCAC only permits students to take each placement test twice (not twice a year, two times total), so please practice before taking the placement test.

Do I need to take a placement test to enroll in a CCAC course?

CCAC requires placement tests for the following courses:

How many times can I take each placement test?

Two attempts can be made to pass the placement test.

I took the SATs and/or ACTs; am I exempt from the placement test?

Students who have earned the following scores are exempt from the corresponding placement tests:

Can I take the CCAC placement test at WAHS during the school day?

Yes, placement tests will be given during class.

After I complete the placement test, what happens next?

Students' scores will be provided immediately. If you earned a qualifying score, you should submit your registration form to your teacher or the main office. If you did not earn a qualifying score and this was your first attempt at the placement test, you may sign up to take the placement test a second time. However, please be aware that CCAC only permits two attempts on each placement test.

What happens if I do not pass my placement test?

Students who do not earn the necessary score on the corresponding placement test will not be eligible to take the course for CCAC credit. However, they **do not** need to transfer out of the course, and this **does not** mean they are not in the appropriate course at West A.

What if I took a class last year or the year before but do not know my CCAC ID?

If you forgot or lost your CCAC Student ID number you can email Mrs. Heyl (<u>mheyl@westasd.org</u>), and she will look it up for you.

What happens if I take the placement test then change my mind about the credit?

Students have until course registration to decide if they would like to take their course(s) for CCAC credit. Registration forms will be given in class and must be submitted by the deadline. If a student completes the placement test, then decides not to register, there will be no penalty.

I got an email from CCAC about meeting with an Advisor, do I need to schedule this?

No. After completing the placement test you may receive emails from CCAC about meeting with an advisor, registering for classes, making payments, etc. Please disregard these emails. You will receive communication from WAHS or Dr. Roche regarding next steps. If you are unsure if you should follow any CCAC emails, please contact Dr. Roche (kroche@westasd.org) for guidance.

RMU Specific Questions

How do I register & pay for classes?

All course registration and payment will be completed through the <u>RMU in the High School Online Portal</u>. The portal can be accessed through the following website: <u>https://highschool.rmu.edu/</u>. Select "High School Student" to get started. Course registration will open on August 26, 2024

Important Dates:

- Monday, August 26, 2024: Course registration opens
- Friday, September 6, 2024: Course registration closes (ECIHSA date)
- Friday, November 15, 2024: RMU tuition payment due (\$250/course)

Do I get a refund if I decide not to complete a course for college credit?

If you drop your course before Friday, November 15th, you will receive a full refund for your course. Course drops can be initiated through the <u>RMU in the High School Online Portal</u> by selecting the "Add/Drop Request" option. No refunds will be issued after the payment deadline (Nov. 15th). The course fee must be paid to receive RMU-credit for a course.

Attending RMU:

When a student successfully completes an RMU course in the ECIHSA program, they are immediately eligible for a \$1,000/year scholarship when attending RMU after high school graduation. Being enrolled in an RMU course in the ECIHSA program also provides students with career exploration opportunities so they are prepared to attend college with credits and career knowledge that translate into a savings of time and money. There is a seamless transition from high school to a four-year institution.

How do I request a transcript from RMU?

Students can request a transcript using the "Request a Transcript" link on the Office of the Registrar webpage: <u>https://www.rmu.edu/academics/provost/registrar</u>. Use the "Student Search" option to locate your student information.

WAHS ECIHSA Courses and Credits

Am I eligible for college credits for my class(es)?

Students enrolled in West Allegheny courses who meet in the face-to-face setting are eligible for college credit through the corresponding college/university partner if they meet the pre-requisites. West Allegheny has 48 courses eligible for college credit.
