


SCHOOL SAFETY HAS BEEN A PRIORITY

POST SANDY HOOK 2013

- PANIC ALARMS INSTALLED IN MAIN OFFICES TO IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY POLICE
- INTERCOM SYSTEM TO ID VISITORS, DOORS UNLOCKED REMOTELY, AND A CAPTURED VESTIBULE FOR VISITORS TO WAIT UNTIL ACCESS IS GRANTED
- LAW ENFORCEMENT ADDED EXTERIOR PERIMETER CHECKS AND FREQUENT VISITS TO SCHOOL
- EXTERIOR KEY LOCKS REMOVED AND ID CARD READERS ADDED
- CAMERA SYSTEM UPGRADED AT MS AND HS





- PA announcement
- Gunfire, screaming, loud noises
- Phone call/text
- May SEE the aggressor

- Traditional lockdown procedure PLUS
 - Barricade the door
 - Spread out within the room
 - Do not huddle
 - Look for alternate escape routes (another door/window)
 - <u>Do NOT</u> open the door for anyone.
 - Dial 911 when it is safe to do so





Use personal and environmental items to secure the door.







Use items to keep the door from opening and place large items in front of the door as obstacles.











Pass on real time information

- A Continuation of ALERT
- Call 911 or text others as soon as safe to do so
- Who, what, where, when, how

Real time information may help

- Know when or if it is safe to switch responses
- Choose the safest evacuation route
- Stay calmer or less anxious



How to COUNTER



• Interrupt process of *shooting accurately*:

- Create Chaos
- Shout, Yell, Scream
- Throw Things
- Sprays

- Move, Move, Move
- Create Barriers
- Divert Attention



What is COUNTER?



It is **NOT** ...

•Fighting

lt is...

- Taking back Control
- Last Resort
- Personal Choice





The preferred response

- Occupants will have the authority to leave the building when they deem appropriate
- Removes as many potential targets as possible
- Evacuate to a pre-determined rally point
- Removes need for concerned others to come to scene





The preferred response

- Law enforcement feels this is the best option will not be like a traditional fire drill
- May be a window, a door that nobody uses, connector doors
- ALICE Evacuation should be faster than a fire drill
- Permission to run and zig-zag down hallway to survive
- Run to the rally point, palms raised running as fast as you can

WORKING TOGETHER TO ENSURE SAFETY

PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

- SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING; HEAR
 SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING (REPORT IT)
- BE VIGILANT AND AWARE OF WHAT YOUR CHILD IS BRINGING TO SCHOOL AND/OR EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES
- SECURE WEAPONS IN THE HOME, CHECK THEM DAILY
- ✓ MONITOR YOUR CHILD'S SOCIAL MEDIA HABITS
- ✓ TALK WITH YOUR CHILD ABOUT THESE ISSUES
- ✓ ASSURE THEM THE DISTRICT HAS COMPREHENSIVE SAFETY PLANS AND OPERATIONS

STUDENTS

- SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING; HEAR SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING
- ✓ DO NOT PROP OPEN DOORS
- ✓ DO NOT OPEN DOORS FOR OTHERS TO GET INSIDE
- RESPECT AND BUILD POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS
- BE INCLUSIVE NOT EXCLUSIVE; DO NOT ISOLATE PEERS
- REPORT SAFETY CONCERNS IMMEDIATELY TO STAFF / OFFICE / PRINCIPAL /SRO
- DO NOT SPREAD RUMORS; SAY SOMETHING


